Magnes Museum, University of California, Berkeley, for seven years, and served as a fundraising consultant for the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco. He worked in various development capacities at The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, from 1997-2002. Leventhal holds an MBA in management and museum studies from John F. Kennedy University, Berkeley; an MA in art history and museum studies from The City College, City University of New York; and a BS in studio art and anthropology from New York University. He currently serves on the board of the Western Museums Association.
